



Overcoming Challenges

- Staff resistance to change
 - "...But what I do is already working..."
- Limited time for regular rounding
- Resource constraints
- Accountability

- Providing sufficient training and ongoing support
- Incorporate rounding into routine clinical practice
- Engaging multidisciplinary teams in the process



Impact: How do we track success

SMART Goal

- Decrease in infection rates
 - E.g., MRSA, *C diff*, COVID-19, wounds
- Compliance rates
 - E.g., hand hygiene, PPE, EVS cleaning
